How do I set up a Standard, Advanced, Starter or StarterPlus mailbox in Windows 8 Mail?

Setting up your Standard, Advanced, Starter or StarterPlus mailbox in Windows 8 *Mail* should take just a few minutes.

Step 1

The first time you open *Mail* on Windows 8 you will be prompted for your Microsoft account details, enter them in the text boxes provided, once done you will be directed to the add new account wizard.

If you already have an email account set up click **Settings**, **Accounts**, **Add an Account**, then **Other Account** to start the wizard.



Step 2

Select IMAP then click Connect.

Step 4

There is a lot of information to fill in on this next screen, let's look at each section bit by bit.

- E-mail Address: Enter your full email address. This is made up of the mailbox name you chose, an @ symbol and your domain name. *you@yourdomain.com* for example.
- Username: Enter your full email address again.
- **Password**: Enter the password you set up when you created the mailbox within your control panel.

Standard and Starter Mailboxes

- **Incoming email server**: Enter *mail.yourdomain.com* (replacing *yourdomain.com* with your domain name).
- **Port**: *143.*
- Incoming Server requires SSL: Unchecked.
- Outgoing *mail* server (SMTP): Enter the SMTP server your ISP supplied you with.
- Port: Change to 587.
- Outgoing server requires SSL: Refer to your ISP for details.
- Outgoing server requires authentication: Refer to your ISP for details.
- Outgoing server requires authentication: Refer to your ISP for details.

StarterPlus and Advanced Mailboxes

- **Incoming email server**: Enter *mail.yourdomain.com* (replacing *yourdomain.com* with your domain name).
- **Port**: *143.*
- Incoming Server requires SSL: Unchecked.
- Outgoing mail server (SMTP): Enter *smtp.yourdomain.com* (replacing *yourdomain.com* with your own domain name) into the text box. If you're using external nameservers you can use **smtp.livemail.co.uk** instead.
- **Port**: Change to 587.
- Outgoing server requires SSL: Unchecked.
- Outgoing server requires authentication: Checked.
- Outgoing server requires authentication: Checked.

Once completed, the screen should look similar to the following:
